

Youth Vision In Action Leadership Awards

On Saturday June 23rd, Youth Vision In Action (YVIA) hosted the second annual Youth Vision in Action Leadership Awards at Dorset Park Day. In celebration of the outstanding leadership contributions of youth to Dorset Park, YVIA received many nominations from community stakeholders that represented Rosalie Hall, McGregor Park Community Centre, Toronto Public Library (TPL), and the City of Toronto. Following an extensive nomination process, YVIA selected three youth leaders in the categories of: (1) Leadership in Education; (2) Leadership in Arts & Creativity; and (3) Leadership in Community.

The Leadership in Education Award is given to a vouth with dedicated involvement in academic activities within a school community including peerbased mentorship, tutoring, counselling or mediation. The recipient of this award was Rabiga Nanthakumar, as nominated by youth outreach workers Emelda Hodiwala and Kavita Bala. Rabiga was recognized for her dedication to school activities at Winston Churchill Collegiate Institute (WCCI), which has included mentoring grade nine students through their transitions into high school, organizing school dances and movie events, and even co-chairing a Toronto District School Board initiative. Rabiga's many leadership accomplishments include participating in the "One Voice One Team" initiative and being WCCI's 2011-2012 Student Council President.

The Leadership in Arts & Creativity Award is given to a youth with dedicated involvement in arts-based clubs and programs including music, dance, drama, poetry, visual arts, writing or photography. The youth must demonstrate an effort in promoting arts and culture in her community. The recipient of this award

was Vathani Ilamurugan. Vathani is an active member of the Youth Advisory Group (YAG) of TPL's McGregor Park branch. Since the YAG was created in 2010, Vathani has been very involved in the planning, development and delivery of library programs for youth, such as Teen Gaming and Teen Movie. She has also helped create displays to promote library programs and Teen Summer Reading. Most recently she created a template for a booklist of titles recommended by the YAG members.

The Leadership in Community Award is given to a youth that with dedicated involvement in volunteerism through community-based initiatives and extracurricular activities that have an impact on Dorset Park. This award was given to Jahnome Turner for his tireless efforts in youth advocacy. As a long-time resident of Dorset Park, Jahnome has been an unsung hero among youth. He is one of the founding mem-
